However, to ensure that program parameters do not vary significantly due to area definition changes, HUD has used custom geographic definitions for the **Kansas City, MO-KS HUD Metro FMR Area**.

<sup>\*</sup> The FY 2014 Consolidated Appropriations Act changed the definition of extremely low-income to be the greater of 30/50ths (60 percent) of the Section 8 very low-income limit or the poverty guideline as
